The 2010 SE DSI Student Paper Competition is open to Ph.D., Masters, and Undergraduate students. Papers submitted in the Student Paper track must be solely of student authorship. Student papers must be submitted on the SE DSI paper submission website (instructions follow) and are subject to the same blind review process as regular papers.

Student papers are invited in the following research areas:

Accounting, Business Ethics, Business Law, Information Privacy and Security
Ag Econ, Environmental Economics, Economics and Finance
Information Systems, MIS, & CIS
Innovative Education and Experiential Learning
Management, Organizational Behavior, Organizational Theory, and Human Resource Management
Marketing and International Business Logistics
Public Sector and Not for Profit
Statistics, Quantitative Management, and Management Science
Supply Chain Management and Logistics, POM and TQM
Teaching and Pedagogy
Web-Based Applications, DSS, AI, and IT

All accepted student papers that are presented at the meeting will receive a \$100 travel stipend (regardless of the number of authors). Accepted papers that are not presented at the meeting do not receive the travel stipend. On the final day of the meeting, students present their research to the Student Paper Judges who will evaluate the quality of the presentations and their underlying research. Outstanding student papers will be recognized at the awards luncheon on the final day of the meeting.

General Instructions:

To submit a student research paper to the 2010 Annual Meeting of SE DSI, please follow the instructions below.

1. Go to the SE DSI website www.sedsi.org.
2. Choose Conference Management System.
3. Sign in if you are an existing user; otherwise, sign up as a new user.
4. Under New Conference Submission, choose to Submit a Paper or Proposal.
5. Choose the Student Paper (SU) track.
6. Enter the title of your paper.
7. Enter any additional student authors of the paper.
8. Upload a PDF version of your paper **WITHOUT** any author or identifying information.
9. Send an email to the Chair of the Student Paper track (Joan Donohue at donohue@moore.sc.edu) indicating whether you are entering your paper into the Ph.D., Masters, or Undergraduate Student Paper Competition.

Participant Obligation:

The submission of a paper to this meeting means that the authors agree to attend the meeting and present their paper. To register for the meeting, follow steps 1-2 above and then choose Pay Conference Registration and Fees. Only those authors who register and pay for the meeting (\$40) in advance of the *Proceedings* publication date will have their papers published.
